



We have many new cleaning protocols and chemicals in place to ensure all areas of the resort are as sanitized as they can be for our guests.

We will limit check-in to 1 guest in the office at a time and masks will be required for check-in. Keys will be sanitized after a guest checks out, and rooms will be sanitized with extra attention to high-touch areas, light switches, door knobs, faucets, remotes, etc. We also have removed all the bedspreads, shams and throw pillows from the rooms for this season and all the other bedding will be stripped and washed after each stay, so that all bedding will be clean and fresh for each new set of guests. These are just a few of the steps we are taking to ensure overall resort cleanliness and guest safety.

Masks are not required on our decks, balconies, picnic table areas and private beach areas, as long as you are with your own group/family. If you are unable to be socially distant (6ft) from other groups/families, then masks are recommended.

Governor Baker has announced he will allow Indoor Pools and Gyms to open on July 6th, so our pool, gym, sun deck, fire pit and tennis and basketball court area will be open on Monday, with all required protocols in place! However, we are not able to open the steam room, sauna and hot tub until Phase 4, and we do not know when this Phase will begin. We will update our website as soon as we know more.

The public town beaches in Truro will not be offering single day passes this summer, but they are still selling weekly passes, so guests will be able to purchase a weekly pass to access Truro Public Beaches, if desired. Please note, this is just for public beaches, this does not apply to our private beach at the resort, which is open and free to all our guests, as always!

The local National Seashore Beaches (Race Point, Herring Cove, Head of the Meadow, etc.) are still selling day passes, \$25 per car, per day, and currently Head of Meadow is not charging because they cannot staff the beach with a lifeguard, but this could change at any time, please visit this site for the most up to date info: <https://www.nps.gov/caco/planyourvisit/fees.htm>
